Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The chairperson is the Chairman of the BASC Scottish Committee. One trustee (the Secretary) is the Director of BASC Scotland. Other trustees are appointed by the above.

Governing Document

The charity's governing document is a deed of trust registered on 15th July 1985.

Charitable Purpose

The charity's purpose is recorded in the deed of trust and is to educate and train young persons in the understanding and management of the countryside and all country pursuits.

Activities and Achievements

Trustee meetings were held on 5^{th} April 2018, 31^{st} May 2018, 8^{th} August 2018 and 1^{st} November 2018.

The Trust sponsored the following activities during the year:

• an educational trip to Tentsmuir National Nature Reserve in Fife for a group of 24 primary school children (SYCET paid for the transport);



- the inaugural 'Junior Macnab Challenge', organised by The Scottish Country Sports Tourism Group and held at the GWCT Scottish Game Fair at Scone Palace in June 2018; this was for youngsters aged 8-21 and there were just over 200 entries over the three days of the fair.
- a half-term 'Activity Day' for a group of youngsters at Roxburghe Shooting School of Excellence in the Scottish Borders in October 2018.

The Trust also ran two free 'Introduction to Bushcraft' days; the first at the Forest of Birse Kirk in Aberdeenshire on 12th July 2018 and the second at Trochry (Perthshire) on 8th August 2018, each attended by 10 youngsters aged 10-18.



Further activities are planned for the forthcoming year.

All receipts in the year were from donations and fundraising and these totalled £5,440.

Trustee remuneration and expenses

The Trustees did not receive any remuneration or expenses during the year.

Employees

For the first time the Trust funded the employment of a part-time administrator and this is reflected in the increased activity of the Trust. (The administrator was an employee of BASC.)

Reserves

As a result of a deficit of £3,924 the Trust held unrestricted funds of £19,143 at the year end. The committee considers that these funds are sufficient to allow the Trust to continue and to support ongoing plans with respect to both fundraising and developing the work of the trust.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Scottish Youth & The Countryside Education Trust

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2019 which are set out on pages 4 to 5.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
